The results are exciting. Here is some of what we achieved:

- Expanded programming with the launch of the Preserve Montana Trades Corps--our hands-on training program for young adults exploring preservation trades careers.
- Engaged hundreds of new supporters through the Explore Montana: Hidden Helena event.
- Increased individual donations and corporate sponsorships by 46% compared to the previous year.

# A Year in Review

In 2024, we launched the Preserve Montana Trades Corps, reinvigorated the popular *Explore Montana: Hidden Helena* historic building tour, replaced the roof and built an ADA ramp at our Baxendale Schoolhouse Preservation Center, garnered legislative support to re-authorize the Montana historic tax credit, published two technical preservation guidance reports, and much more.


